Description

R.C. Gorman (1932 - 2005, Native American) - "Wild Flowers" (1990) - This lithograph is pencil signed/dated and numbered (58/224) by the artist. COA from the publisher. The image measures 27" x 36" and with the beautiful frame and matting, it is 42" x 49." Ships free in the USA. Rudolph Carl Gorman was a member of the Navajo Nation and his paintings are primarily of Native American women. The New York Times referred to him as "the Picasso of American Indian artists." R.C. Gorman, was born in Chinle, Arizona. During his early years he lived in a Hogan and had little experience with the world beyond the Navajo reservation. He was raised by his grandmother who ignited his ambition by recounting Navajo legends and by acquainting him with his artistic ancestors. In 1958 he received the first scholarship ever given by the Navajo tribe for study outside the United States. At Mexico City College, Gorman had exposure to the artists Rivera, Siqueiros, and Tamayo, who inspired him to chang
